

# **AFPHS 6Cs Training and Implementation Guide**

## Module 4: Capacity Building Strategies for Collecting, Analyzing, and Translating Data

The structure of Module 4 differs from that of the first three modules and is intended to guide practitioners from the learning phase to the application phase. Module 4 should expand understanding and build capacity around public health data on older adults, and particularly the value of data to understand the older adult population, their challenges, needs, and interventions that may be implemented to meet those needs.

**Definition:** Collecting, analyzing, and translating relevant and robust data on older adults can help identify the needs and assets of a community and inform the development of interventions to improve older adult health.

Assessing and monitoring health status and factors that influence health are part of the 10 Essential Public Health Services. Public health practitioners are very skilled in data analysis and translating results to meet the needs of the community. Understanding demographic and health trends may help to develop advocacy tools as well as raise awareness among potential partners.

#### **Module 4 Learning Objectives:**

- 1. Identify examples of data dashboards, indicators, and data sources that could be considered for inclusion into broader public health data profiles or a data dashboard.
- 2. Identify partners and potential opportunities for creating or expanding your jurisdictions' data dashboard to include older adult health and well-being.
- 3. Gain practical experience in creating an outward-facing resource that includes older adult health data.
